According to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development,

in 2021 the number of older adults experiencing sheltered homelessness is on the rise.

"This growing population has extraordinarily high physical and mental health needs that the nation's homelessness systems are not trained or resourced. to appropriately meet on their own."



In 2022

Mendo Co:

29% of people living in shelters are over the age of 55;
16% of those living outdoors are over the age of 55.

Hospitality House

This year 5-7 elders have stayed at the shelter every month. Averaging 19% of our guests.

WELLNESS

Our licensed clinicians in the **Hospitality Center Specialty Mental Health Clinic** provide therapy, care management, rehab, and referrals for physical and mental health care and addiction.

Coastal Street Medicine

staff sees those in need of immediate medical care and assists with referrals for advanced care. Since the program started in 2018, it has served over half of the homeless on the Coast, keeping many out of the emergency room and back to good health care.

The **Wellness Center** facilitates group meetings that include life skills, application assistance, referrals to other resources, stress management, several therapeutic art and related sessions. Classes are offered by staff and volunteers. Vocational Services also take place here. 12-Step groups meet regularly in our group room.

SHELTER AND HOUSING

HOSPITALITY HOUSE

has 24 beds to shelter
those in need for up to
180 days. Moving from
the street to a clean bed
with showers, meals and
laundry facilities can
make a world of
difference.

TRANSITIONAL HOUSING

The 24 additional beds
provide temporary
housing until a
permanent situation can
be found.

THE PLATEAU

The new development for
permanent supported
housing in Fort Bragg.
Our staff provides a wide
range of services to
residents on site.

HOUSING NAVIGATION

Through programs like
Rapid-Rehousing and
CaAIM Community
Supports, our staff helps
place those in need of
permanent supported
housing in private units.
They then provide case
management, acting as
liaison with landlords and
assisting with move in
costs.

WINTER SHELTER

MCHC staff, in
collaboration with the Fort
Bragg Police Department,
screens and approves
motel vouchers for those
who qualify for the Winter
Shelter program.

GIVE HOPE

Some people have been
living in camps or under
bridges for years. We
strive to give them new
